



CANADIAN GROUP EXPANDS SUPPORT FOR UKRAINE'S OLYMPIC ATHLETES

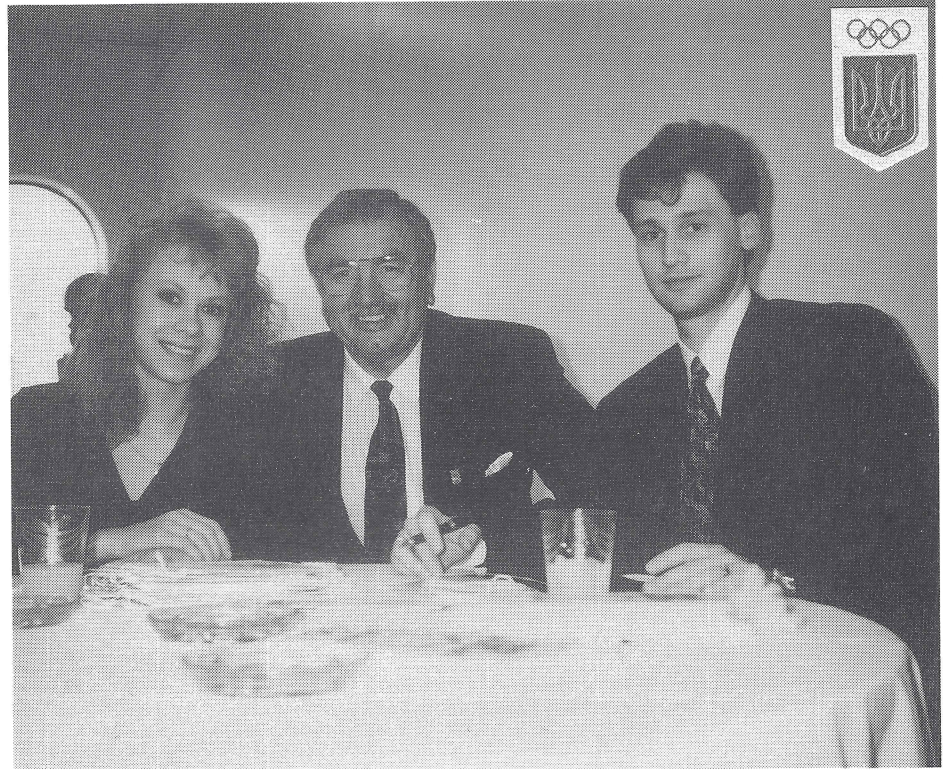
The Canadian Friends of the National Olympic Committee of Ukraine, established at the recommendation of the 1993 World Congress of Ukrainians in Toronto, has now provided financial support to the Committee for the Lillehammer Games and is expanding its fundraising activities for the Atlanta Games in 1996.

Following the dissolution of the Soviet Union, all required equipment and funding was taken away and absorbed into Moscow. The Canadian Friends are one of a number of international groups assisting the Ukrainian Olympic Committee with training, equipment, uniforms, travel, etc. Jackets with the Ukrainian Olympic logos were provided for Lillehammer. Donations are being received for a blood testing machine for the athletes. Many worthwhile projects are being organized, particularly to provide training facilities and accommodation within Canada for various visiting Ukrainian teams prior to the Atlanta Olympic Games.

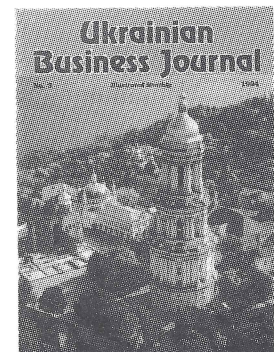

WHO'S WHO IN UKRAINE: METROPOLITAN BUSINESS GUIDE ON DISKETTE

The Petro Mohyla Academic Society of Kyiv has produced a Who's Who data bank for Ukraine for IBM-compatible systems. The data bank contains information, including biographical data, on more than 1,100 top politicians of Ukraine, key officials in politics, public organizations, trade unions, and business enterprises, at the national, regional and local office levels. English and Ukrainian versions are available, and the information is updated quarterly through the Society. The program allows users to find and print records, add records, produce mailing labels and past information to ASCII files for use in word processing.
